Homework

Homework at KS4 is weekly. It will consist of aural skills exercises, set as google forms, with links to the folders of relevant audio. These are self-marking, but will be monitored and a log kept to check progress. Pupils may need to repeat tasks as necessary.

There will also be retrieval/revision tasks using knowledge organisers, as well as individual performance preparation.

Assessment

- Regular assessed aural tasks
- Past papers in scheduled exam weeks
- Half-termly composing tasks assessed us the GCSE marking criteria
- Half-termly performing tasks assessed using the GCSE marking criteria

Exams and Controlled Assessment

- Written paper Summer exam period
- 2 compositions - 1 due by Christmas of Y11, 1 due by Easter of Y11
- 2 performances - 1 due by Christmas of Y11, 1 due by Easter of Y11
