Students will be taught to:

- Respond to spoken language, extracting information, drawing conclusions and identifying opinions
- Initiate and sustain conversations expressing ideas, manipulating structures, and justifying opinions
- Respond effectively to written language from a range of texts, identifying opinions and inferring meaning
- Write effectively for different purposes explaining ideas, expressing and justifying opinions and manipulating vocabulary and grammar, including some more complex language
- Become word rich by using a range of recall techniques and exposure to a wide range of vocabulary
