Bugsy Malone Cast Breakdown

MAIN CHARACTERS

- **Bugsy Malone** Street-smart, charming narrator who gets caught between rival gangs. A reluctant hero with a good heart.
- **Blousey Brown** Strong-willed and ambitious aspiring singer. She's independent and dreams of going to Hollywood.
- Fat Sam Loud, dramatic owner of the Grand Slam Speakeasy. Desperate to protect his empire from Dandy Dan.
- **Tallulah** Glamorous and flirty lounge singer at Fat Sam's club. She's Fat Sam's girlfriend and enjoys attention.
- **Dandy Dan** Sophisticated, smooth-talking gangster. A dangerous rival to Fat Sam, always one step ahead.
- Leroy Smith A strong, silent outsider and boxer who becomes Bugsy's ally and helps take down the bad guys.
- **Fizzy** Kind and optimistic janitor at Fat Sam's club. Dreams of dancing but is often overlooked.
- Knuckles Fat Sam's well-meaning but clumsy henchman. Loyal, simple, and used for comic relief.
- **Ritzy** Member of Fat Sam's gang. Often caught in the wrong place at the wrong time.
- Louis Nervous and jittery gangster in Fat Sam's crew. Often panics under pressure.
- Snake Eyes Superstitious gangster in Fat Sam's crew. Quiet but part of the comic trio with Ritzy and Louis.
- **O'Dreary** Dim-witted and lovable police officer. Always a step behind the action.
- Captain Smolsky Frustrated police chief trying to crack down on the gang war. Stern and serious.
- **Cagey Joe** Tough but wise old boxing trainer. Helps Leroy prepare for the final confrontation. Has a strong presence despite limited lines.

MINOR CHARACTERS

- **Roxy Robinson** Fat Sam's unlucky associate. Gets splurged in the opening scene.
- Laughing Boy Creepy, silent member of Dandy Dan's gang. (non-speaking)
- Yonkers Loyal henchman of Dandy Dan. Usually silent but visually present. (non-speaking)
- Benny Lee Dandy Dan's quiet gang member. (non-speaking)
- **Pop Becker** Bookshop owner who secretly runs Fat Sam's speakeasy front.
- Girl Singers Trio who perform musical numbers and add flair to scenes.
- Oscar De Velt Pompous theatre agent judging Blousey's audition.
- Lena Marrelli Diva performer whose rehearsal is interrupted.
- Waitress Diner server with a sarcastic attitude.
- Radio Announcer Voice-only role providing scene transitions. (non-speaking/on voiceover)
- Seymour Scoop Overenthusiastic reporter chasing the gangland story.
- **Sound Man** Follows Scoop with a microphone. (non-speaking)
- English Reporter Formal, dramatic journalist.
- Foreign Reporters 1 & 2 Confused reporters with comic timing. (minimal or non-speaking)
- Violinist Plays mournfully after splurges. (non-speaking)
- Undertakers (2) Carry off splurged characters. (non-speaking)
- **Barber** Appears in early ambush scene and is quickly splurged.
- Butler Works for Dandy Dan. Brief but present. (non-speaking)
- Tillie, Loretta, Dotty, Bangles Chorus girls at Fat Sam's club. Full of personality.
- Marbini Comic magician with a bad audition act.

- Ventriloquist Dummy Speaks through ventriloquist; has attitude.
- Shady Sneaky informant working both sides.
- Looney Bergonzi Hired hitman. Strange and silent. (non-speaking)
- Chinese Laundry Workers Ambushed by gangsters. (non-speaking)
- **Boxers** Appear in training scene with Cagey Joe. (non-speaking)
- Cagey Joe Tough, wise boxing coach who helps Leroy.
- Pickett & Velma Small roles, may appear in crowd or club scenes. (non-speaking)
- **Down and Outs** Appear in "Down and Out" number. (may be silent or ensemble)
- **Priest** Appears in background of a club or street scene. (non-speaking)
- **Cooks** Background in Fat Sam's club. (non-speaking)
- Baseball Guards Appear in final confrontation. (non-speaking)
- Baby Face Youngest member of gangland chaos. Usually a cameo. (non-speaking)
- Policemen Appear with Smolsky and O'Dreary. (mostly non-speaking)
- Razamataz Possibly a nightclub act or side character. (non-speaking)
- Flash Frankie Fat Sam's unlucky lawyer. He arrives in Scene 1 but is quickly splurged in the crossfire. A short, non-speaking comic role.
- **Bronx Charlie** A member of **Dandy Dan's gang**, seen in the opening scene. Cocky, flashy, and full of attitude, he helps set the tone for the gang war and delivers a few short lines.

ENSEMBLE GROUPS

• Fat Sam's Gang

Loyal but incompetent mobsters working for Fat Sam. Often used for comic relief and appear in chase and splurge scenes. *Includes: Knuckles, Ritzy, Louis, Snake Eyes, plus ensemble roles.*

• Dandy Dan's Gang

Slick, well-dressed criminals armed with splurge guns. Move with style and precision, often splurging others silently. *Includes: Yonkers, Benny Lee, Laughing Boy, and other suited ensemble members.*

• Showgirls / Chorus Girls

Perform in Fat Sam's Grand Slam Speakeasy. Confident dancers and singers who help bring energy and glamour to musical numbers. *Includes: Tillie, Loretta, Dotty, Bangles, Girl Singers, plus ensemble dancers.*

• Down and Outs

A group of disheartened city people who appear in the song **"Down and Out."** Used to show the contrast between wealth and poverty. *Usually ensemble actors in ragged costumes; featured in Bugsy's solo.*

• Reporters and Paparazzi

Energetic and dramatic journalists covering the gangland war. Often comic and exaggerated in movement and speech. *Includes: Seymour Scoop, English Reporter, Foreign Reporters, Sound Man, plus additional ensemble.*

• Audition Performers

A rotating group of terrible or eccentric acts auditioning for De Velt. Used for comic vignettes. *Includes: Marbini (magician), Ventriloquist, Lena Marrelli, plus optional extras.*

• Boxers

Appear in the gym scenes with Cagey Joe. Typically non-speaking but physically expressive. Usually male ensemble; may include Leroy and Bugsy depending on production.

• Club Patrons / Dancers

Background extras in the nightclub scenes who react, dance, and sometimes sing along with songs like "Fat Sam's Grand Slam." *Often drawn from chorus girls, boxers, and gang members in other scenes.*

• Wait Staff & Workers

Includes Waitress, Cooks, Chinese Laundry Workers, Barber, and Waiter. Support background realism.

Non-speaking or single-line roles; may double with other ensemble roles.

This session is for students auditioning for **lead or featured roles** in *Bugsy Malone*. You will be expected to prepare and perform **one piece from the audition pack** (either a script extract, a song, or both – depending on the character you're auditioning for).

Students may audition for **one main character** only, but on their audition form they can **list other characters they are happy to be considered for**. This allows us to best match you to a role that suits your strengths while keeping the casting process fair and flexible.

I mean this play's only just started and already the stage is full of stiffs! Oh, by the way, you're probably wondering who I am. My name's Malone, Bugsy Malone.

BUGSY: (to *audience*) With an Italian Mother and an Irish Father I'd naturally grown up a little confused. I didn't see much future as a spaghetti waiter at Mama Lugini's or pushing a pen at City Hall, so I'd drifted from this to that, you know, walking the line, trying hard not to fall either side ... until, that is, the night I walked in here to Pop Becker's Book Store.

O'DREARY: Gee Captain. I'm sorry sir, I didn't see you there, honestly I didn't ... **SMOLSKY:** You dumb potato face Irish jerk!

[He chases him around the stage.]

O'DREARY: Couldn't help it, Captain ... Gee, I'm sorry, Captain Smolsky. It was an accident, honestly.

SMOLSKY: If I catch you, O'Dreary, I'm gonna punch that stupid Irish nose right back to Tipperary.

DANDY DAN (smiling): You've been watching too many movies, Sam.

FAT SAM: O.K. Looney, let him have it!

[Looney leaps [roin heiririd a tree. His green pies seem to be at the ready, but there doesn't seem to be much intelligence flickering behind his creamy, staring eyes. Bugsy still crouches behind the cut -out bush.]

DANDY DAN: Yonkers! Charlie! Quick, it's a double-cross!
