Dear Parents/Carers,

As we reach the end of term, we would like to say a huge thank you for all your support during what has been a fully packed term. This letter will replace the Parent Bulletin for this week.

Can we take this opportunity to thank you for all your support this year, it has been very much appreciated. It has been a privilege to work with your children and we have enjoyed watching them grow and develop into the wonderful young people they are today. Uniform:
