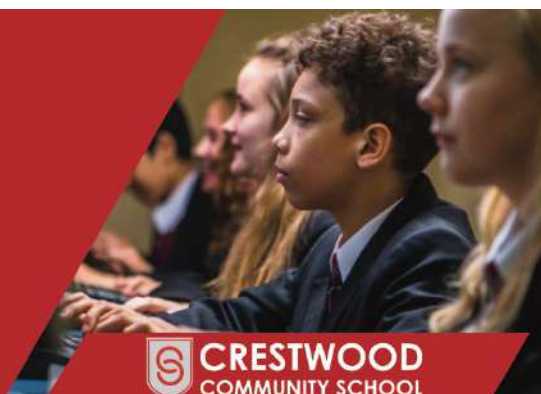

My name is Melanie Saunders and I'm proud to be a co-opted governor at Crestwood Community School. I have been involved in education all my working life starting as an English teacher in Hertfordshire in the 1980s, I became a deputy head in Essex and the head of an 11-18 school in Cumbria.

Whilst working for Hampshire County Council, I had the opportunity to chair the Interim Executive Board (IEB) of a school in very challenging circumstances. This gave me the chance to see school leadership from the other side of the table, so I really appreciate what a great job both the senior team and the governing body do at Crestwood and the amazing support there is from parents – what a fantastic community feeling there is here!

I am the Link Governor for maths and it has been interesting to find out about how creatively this subject is delivered at Crestwood from the head of maths and from my visits to the school. Being part of the merger of two schools and supporting the new school to become even more successful is very exciting as well as challenging. I and all my fellow governors share the determination to make this a great school for all our children and hope we can add just a little behind the scenes to help.

What is the Nurturing Programme?

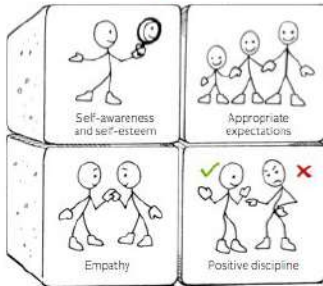
Children are rewarding, stimulating and fun, but looking after them can be stressful and challenging.

A tried and tested programme, it helps us think about what we do, why we do it and how it makes us feel.



The Building Blocks of the Nurturing Programme



What does it cover?

Over the 10-week Programme, you will look at lots of different topics, including

- Understanding** why children behave as they do
- Recognising** the feelings behind behaviour (ours and theirs)
- Exploring** different approaches to discipline
- Finding** ways to develop co-operation and self-discipline in children
- Learning** the importance of looking after ourselves

Practical information

Partners are welcome and it's also fine to come on your own or with a relative or friend

There are ten 2-hour sessions with a tea and coffee break

5-10 parents are invited and there are two Family Links trained group leaders
