School Coronavirus Update - Friday 15th May 2020**

Thank you, as always, for your continued support and understanding through such a pressured time. As you will be aware the Government has issued guidance to schools to partially reopen from 1st June, but, I sit here writing this to you, watching the daily coronavirus briefing, hearing that the rate of infection has risen close to 1 again in the UK. One of the five conditions to be met for schools reopening is “there is reliable data that shows the rate of infection is decreasing to manageable levels”. Very clearly this is not being met at present, so the future of reopening is all but a wish, not yet a reality.

Crestwood has been so ahead of many schools with our online, live, learning, I am so proud of everyone's efforts, it truly is spectacular. Students have said that they really enjoy the lessons and often get a more valuable learning experience than if they were at school because there are fewer competing distractions that they could encounter, such as from their friends in a class. Therefore, it is imperative that this is not compromised in any plans we have to reopen because all our students' education matters, we cannot favour one year group over another.

As a secondary school, we are still awaiting further advice next week, after teaching unions have met with the Department for Education today to discuss how viable opening actually is. Initially the guidance for secondary schools states that we should plan to have some face to face contact with **YEAR 10** students only. Alongside this we are planning for those students who have an **EHCP** to have some face to face contact with school, but this will be agreed with parents on an individualised basis.

We have started the process, as a leadership team, of working through all the implications of the government guidance and that from Hampshire County Council. As you will appreciate, this is an enormous task and we have a fantastic team of staff who are rising to the challenge, as ever, tackling each area to be considered in small working groups.

The primary schools have been told that provision must be over 5 days per week for Early Years, Yrs 1 and 6, stating that part time and rotas are not appropriate. However, as a secondary I believe we cannot offer this **and** maintain the live online learning for **all** students. At this moment, we believe, keeping to our current routine of opening on Tuesdays and Wednesdays would limit the risk of infection, protect staff and students equally and comply with face to face interaction for Year 10 students.

The Government has issued guidance to schools, [Coronavirus \(COVID-19\): implementing protective measures in education and childcare settings](#). I am dismayed at this stating, for example, that temperatures do not need to be taken on entry and that PPE for staff or students is not appropriate. Further DfE [Parental Guidance](#) was also released this week.

Any proposal for reopening that we develop will have these guiding principles at its heart:

- It is completely safe to open, based on scientific advice.
- Minimising students in school at any one time to avoid spreading any infections
- Minimising staff in school at any one time to avoid spreading any infections
- Building the confidence of staff and students to leave their homes and feel safe
- Re-establishing relationships between staff and students
- Ensuring stringent cleaning can be undertaken between occupation periods
- Efficient approach to ensure online learning can still occur which has proved, thus far, to be having a positive impact on learning and wellbeing

Any opening would also have to comply with the following, creating a 'bubble' of protection:

- Each campus zoned into distinct areas that cannot be entered by others
- Students grouped into classes that can be housed in rooms that comply with social distancing
- Student groups using different entrances and exits to avoid gatherings
- Student groups to stay in their zoned areas
- Students to be with the same teacher each session
- Rigorous cleaning between each set of students to ensure control of the spread of any infection

Whilst we are actively planning and do have a potential solution, there is no certainty that schools will actually open as stated at the start of this lesson. Any opening of schools has to be done when the scientific advice says it is safe to do so. As Headteacher, in consultation with our governors, I will retain the power to make decisions regarding the health and safety of students and staff based on our own risk assessments. This ultimately could mean that we are not in a position to expand student numbers, from that of critical worker children, from the 1st June. It is up to each Headteacher to decide what is right for their students and community and as you know that is at the heart of every decision I make.

I want to reassure you that I, alongside my team, will be doing everything we can to keep you informed of our plans and make sure we are doing everything we can to ensure we are ready to receive **Year 10 and a small selection of students with EHCPs** if and when it is safe to do so. Although we have a potential plan, we do not feel it is appropriate, at this time, to share it with you until the final guidance is issued.

Every family has different circumstances and you may feel that your child returning to school may not be the best and safest thing and I totally respect that decision, you are their parents. You will not be penalised for your child's non attendance but please ensure they engage with online provision.

I would ask Year 10 parents to help us in our planning by completing the questionnaire that will be sent to you separately, to help understand your views. Parents of children with an EHCP will be contacted individually by the SEN team.

As for Year 6 transition we are planning how this can be accommodated safely. We know how important it is that students get the opportunity to visit us before they start in September, getting familiar with their new classes and teachers. We will be as creative as we possibly can, watch this space!

The government's guidance has changed and it is vital that we follow the advice, if not we will find ourselves back in lockdown:

Stay Alert

We can all help control the virus if we all stay alert. This means you must:

- Stay at home as much as possible
- Work from home if you can
- Limit contact with other people
- Keep your distance if you go out (2 metres apart where possible)
- Wash your hands regularly
- Self-isolate if you or anyone in your household has symptoms.

Home schooling

- Full details of the students' timetable can be found at the end of this letter for the week beginning 18th May.
- As you can see we have now added a tutor time to the timetable and other wider subjects for Year 10 such as Music, Drama and Art so that students can meet with their tutor and we can check up on wellbeing. This sees all Year 10 option subjects now covered by live lessons on line.
- Where students do not have lessons timetabled they are expected to complete work independently in preparation for the live lessons and for other subjects.
- We know there have been some technical issues and teething problems, please be patient.

- The sessions are recorded so they can be viewed by students later, if they miss the live version due to restrictions in IT equipment.
- **Please use the email link or link in google classrooms and be connected to the internet, it will use a lot of mobile data.**
- We appreciate that some of your children may need additional stationery to support their work at home. If they do, can you email resourcehub@crestwood.hants.sch.uk letting us know what you need. We need to ensure social distancing and so we will prepare all orders on a Tuesday for

collection on Wednesdays from the Cherbourg campus. **Please do not just turn up, you will be given an appointment time to come and collect stationery.**

- Updates to the work packs issued can be made available if required. These can also be requested by emailing resourcehub@crestwood.hants.sch.uk. If you can identify the subject/s needed that would be appreciated. Please note that these may take a little longer to compile. An appointment will also be arranged so that you can collect these once they are ready.

SEN students with an EHCP:

- Some students with EHCP have found online live lessons far better at home and as a result may not wish to return for face to face sessions, which is completely acceptable.
- Any sessions we are planning will mirror the school opening arrangements for Year 10 and Critical Workers on a Tuesday and a Wednesday.
- Intervention support is also being planned to be delivered online by smaller group sessions rather than face to face.
- Key workers will contact parents to agree individualised plans for students.
- Unfortunately, some students, including those in Year 10, will be unable to come into school as they cannot comply with social distancing or we do not have the staffing capacity to meet needs and ensure their safety. This will be decided on an individual basis by a risk assessment which will be shared with parents when the decision is made.

ICT Hardware and Internet Access for students:

I am acutely aware that some students do not have access to a computer, tablet or device at home. We have ipads in school that can now be loaned out by priority need, starting with Year 10.

Mr. Whittick will be in touch to those that are eligible to arrange collection. A loan agreement has to be signed by the parent and it is your responsibility to cover the cost of damage, loss or theft.

Concerns about your child:

- Despite being open with a skeletal staff, we will not be conducting any face to face meetings with parents or accepting visitors on site during this time.
- You can email teaching and support staff, all emails are available on the school website. Staff will respond between 8.30am and 3pm, Monday to Friday. If you email outside of these times you may have to wait for a response until the next working day.

- Please remember the delivery days are staggered and we cannot guarantee the day the parcel will be delivered each fortnight. It will arrive at some point in the week. I apologise that we cannot be more precise, we know that some of you rely on this parcel.
- The boxes are preloaded and you cannot request alternative food. The company will do their best to change things each time but it is not guaranteed. We are trying our best to bring the food to you. Try and search for recipes you can make with the ingredients offered, you may find you can make something new to your family.
- We have created accounts in your name with Harvest Fine Foods to allow for home delivery but the billing is linked to Crestwood Community School. **Any additional food you would like from Harvest must be ordered separately and you must pay for these yourself.** Anyone trying to order from their Crestwood generated account will be contacted for additional payments by Harvest.
- You are not entitled to receive vouchers in addition to the food boxes, the boxes fulfill your entitlement. Please be aware if we had relied on the national scheme, you would have only just received your first entitlement, we were ahead of the game!
- In order to receive these boxes you must have registered for the scheme to comply with GDPR regulations. If you have failed to register and believe you are eligible please contact julia.hughes@crestwood.hants.sch.uk.

School opening for children of critical workers

I must remind you that the government has asked parents to keep their children at home and asked schools to remain open **only for those children who absolutely need to attend**. As we are a secondary school this applies to almost all of our students.

- We operate from the Cherbourg Campus and provide supervision for a very small number of children of critical workers in the NHS, Uniformed Services and vulnerable children.
- This operates on a part week basis (currently Tuesday and Wednesdays), due to need.
- The provision runs from 8.30am - 2pm.
- Students conduct the online live learning they would be doing at home.
- We have limited spaces and have to maintain skeletal staffing to observe social distancing.

Finally, just a reminder of the NHS guidance:

- if you live alone and you have symptoms of coronavirus illness (COVID-19), however mild, stay at home for **7 days** from when your symptoms started. (The [ending isolation](#) section below has more information)
- after 7 days, if you do not have a high temperature, you do not need to continue to self-isolate. If you still have a high temperature, keep self-isolating until your temperature returns to normal. You do not need to self-isolate if you just have a cough after 7 days, as a cough can last for several weeks after the infection has gone
- if you live with others and you are the first in the household to have symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), then you must stay at home for 7 days, but all other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for **14 days**. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. See the [explanatory diagram](#)
- for anyone else in the household who starts displaying symptoms, they need to stay at home for 7 days from when the symptoms appeared, regardless of what day they are on in the original 14 day isolation period. - staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community
- if you can, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period
- if you cannot move vulnerable people out of your home, stay away from them as much as possible
- reduce the spread of infection in your home: wash your hands regularly for 20 seconds, each time using soap and water, or use hand sanitiser; cover coughs and sneezes
- if you have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms:
 - do **not** go to a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital
 - you do not need to contact 111 to tell them you're staying at home
 - testing for coronavirus (COVID-19) is not needed if you're staying at home
- if you feel you cannot cope with your symptoms at home, or your condition gets worse, or your symptoms do not get better after 7 days, then use the [NHS 111 online](#) coronavirus (COVID-19) service. If you do not have internet access, call NHS 111. For a medical emergency dial 999
- if you develop new coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms at any point after ending your first period of isolation (self or household) then you need to follow the same guidance on self-isolation again

I am so sorry at the apparent lack of clarity, hopefully next week I will be able to share with you my plan for reopening for Year 10 and some EHCP students, but, until I have a steer from the government I do not wish to present you something that later changes. I am in awe of all of you, parents, students and staff. Thank you from the bottom of my heart for everything you do and continue to do. I am truly blessed to be the headteacher of such a wonderful school.

REMOTE LEARNING FROM 18th MAY 2020 GUIDE TO STUDENTS AND PARENTS

Aims

- To give students and parents more structure to the home-learning school day
- To avoid overwhelming students and parents
- To engage more students
- To provide regular interactive contact between students and teaching staff
- To better support students and parents

Summary (from Monday 18th May 2020)

- Live online teaching will continue for English, Maths, Science, Geography, History, Spanish, French and PE.
- Live lessons have now been added for all Year 10 GCSE classes
- English, Maths, Science will continue to deliver one taught lesson per week (session 1) and one tutorial style lesson per week (session 2).
- All other subjects will combine delivery of a taught and tutorial style lesson once per week.
- Wherever possible, session timings match the slots on students' normal timetables.
- Students should log into Google Classroom and locate their classes.
- Links to live lessons can be found in Google Classroom. Teachers will also email links.
- Please note, live sessions can be accessed by mobile phones.
- Work for other subjects should continue, ideally according to students' normal timetable.
- Expectations of students, especially in terms of staying safe, are detailed below.
- **Please note, a tutor time session has now been added per year group per week**
- Updated timetables for each year group and campus are at the end.

Expectations of students and staying safe

- Do not share private information.
- Do not respond to contact or meeting requests from people you do not know, only follow the link sent by your teacher.
- Be respectful in all your communications. Live streaming means any comments you make will be seen by others and you will not be able to delete or edit them.
- Ensure you know who to tell if you see or hear anything upsetting or inappropriate.
- Devices should be used in appropriate areas only, not in bedrooms for example.
- Students' cameras *must* be switched off, you should only see the teacher.
- Turn off your microphone when others are speaking, this will stop background noise.
- You can use the chat feature to ask questions of the teacher.
- Language must be appropriate, including from any family members in the background.
- Ensuring all live-streaming is conducted in group/class settings and never conducted one-to-one. This helps to safeguard both teachers and students.
- Please note, sessions will be recorded and saved to Google Classroom.
- Please do not email your teachers before 8.30am or after 4pm. You can always schedule your email to send to ensure it goes between the times stipulated.
