School Coronavirus Update - Friday 22nd May 2020**

I write this letter to you after last week stating we would have clearer guidance to shape our planning and subsequent actions for reopening potentially from 1st June 2020. Ultimately, we have been asked to **plan to prepare for the eventuality but not to open**. The government has to formally grant a 'section 38' to reopen schools, we cannot merely do this on our own. Unfortunately, as yet, we have not received any further information from the government and I, with others in my team, sense a potential change or delay in the original plan for opening more widely our secondary schools.

I was in total dismay watching the news this morning, which showed huge numbers of people on the beach at Bournemouth and elsewhere, in no way adhering to social distancing. If adults can't follow the rules of social distancing how can we expect our children to do so? I stress that schools will not be able to reopen if some people keep behaving in such a reckless and irresponsible manner. The situation is hard for everyone but everyone has to do their part. As you know there are 5 tests that need to be met before schools open and this will be reviewed on Thursday 28th May 2020, let's hope that, given some of the behaviour witnessed this week, we will meet them and we are given the go ahead to open.

However, regrettably, and I sincerely hope you understand my stance on this, that given all the delay in much needed guidance from the central government I am not prepared to open our doors to Year 10 and a wider number of children on the 1st June as we had planned, therefore we will continue educating our young people remotely.

You will know from the media there has been a battle between teachers unions and the government. I need to be very clear that the vast majority of Crestwood staff are not backing this action and have told me they want to be in school, supporting the plan we have in place, regardless of any potential risk. The staff are such an inspiration and their dedication is second to none.

It is reassuring that we, at least, do have a plan in place to give confidence to our staff, students and parents. We are doing everything we can to ensure that, when we do eventually open, it is in the safest possible way. Every situation is being meticulously planned for by staff from all areas of the school, we would never put the staff or the children at risk. One could argue that no point will ever be the right point to reopen but we have to plan to do so. Opening schools to selected pupils must be seen as part of the recovery process for all.

My decision, therefore, is to share with you the plan today, found on Page 9 of this letter, despite it not being implemented on 1st June as we originally thought. I am sharing the plan with **all** of you, so you can see the thought, planning and preparation that has happened prior

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to today and build your confidence as parents that we know what we are doing and that your children will be safe,

In the potential event of opening from 8th June, I do however need to stress that Year 10 parents must request a place for their child due to health and safety requirements. If you do not do this your child will not be allowed on site when we do open. Please complete the google form sent to you by Monday 1st June at the latest to help us assess need and plan effectively.

I have already shared with you my positive views on the high quality online live learning that is taking place. As a result of planning to accommodate a potential reopening, **we have changed our timetable for remote learning for all students. Please ensure you familiarise yourself the new timetable, at the end of this letter, in advance of virtual school resuming 1st June.**

Later in this letter you will see that the Governors have wholeheartedly backed a £25,000 investment into the purchasing of 100 Google Chromebooks to allow us to loan out ICT equipment to those in most need. Mr. Whittick is overseeing this scheme and if you feel you are desperately in need he can be contacted at andrew.whittick@crestwood.hants.sch.uk. We are a school of 1200 children, therefore whilst 100 seems a lot, it does not go very far. If you have already responded to a survey or phone call you do not need to make a second request.

When the time comes to reopen this term, every family has different circumstances and you may feel that your child returning to school may not be the best and safest thing and I totally respect that decision, you are their parents. You will not be penalised for your child's non attendance but please ensure they engage with online provision.

To ease your navigation through the rest of this letter, I have highlighted in **yellow any new areas.**

The government's guidance is as follows:

Stay Alert

We can all help control the virus if we all stay alert. This means you must:

- Stay at home as much as possible
- Work from home if you can
- Limit contact with other people
- Keep your distance if you go out (2 metres apart where possible)
- Wash your hands regularly
- Self-isolate if you or anyone in your household has symptoms.

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Online, live lessons:

- Full details of the students timetable can be found at the end of this letter for the week beginning 1st June 2020
- As a result of planning to extend the opening of the school beyond that of critical worker children to Year 10 and a small selection of children with an EHCP, we have had to change the timetable completely to accommodate this.
- Where students do not have lessons timetabled they are expected to complete work independently in preparation for the live lessons and for other subjects.
- We know there have been some technical issues and teething problems, please be patient.
- If you have any IT issues please email itsupport@crestwood.hants.sch.uk
- If you have any questions regarding the learning please email steve.gibbs@crestwood.hants.sch.uk if your child is at the Shakespeare campus and tim.nash@crestwood.hants.sch.uk is at the Cherbourg Campus.
- Please note online lessons can be accessed via mobile phones.
- The sessions are recorded so they can be viewed by students later, if they miss the live version due to restrictions in IT equipment.
- **Please use the email link or link in google classrooms and be connected to the internet, it will use a lot of mobile data.**
- We appreciate that some of your children may need additional stationery to support their work at home. If they do, can you email resourcehub@crestwood.hants.sch.uk letting us know what you need. We need to ensure social distancing and so we will prepare all orders on a Tuesday for collection on Wednesdays from the Cherbourg campus. **Please do not just turn up, you will be given an appointment time to come and collect stationery.**
- Updates to the work packs issued can be made available if required. These can also be requested by emailing resourcehub@crestwood.hants.sch.uk. If you can identify the subject/s needed that would be appreciated. Please note that these may take a little longer to compile. An appointment will also be arranged so that you can collect these once they are ready.

SEN students with an EHCP:

- Some students with EHCP have found online live lessons far better at home and as a result may not wish to return for face to face sessions, which is completely acceptable.
- When we open, any face to face sessions have been planned will mirror the school opening arrangements for Year 10 on a Tuesday and a Wednesday.
- Intervention support is also being planned to be delivered online by smaller group sessions rather than face to face.

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- Key workers will have had contact with parents to agree individualised plans for students. If this is not the case please email the key worker.
- Unfortunately, some students, including those in Year 10, will be unable to come into school when we open, as they cannot comply with social distancing or we do not have the staffing capacity to meet needs and ensure their safety. This will be decided on an individual basis by a risk assessment which will be shared with parents when the decision is made.

ICT Hardware and Internet Access for students:

- As a result of Governors approval we have invested £25,000 in new Google Chromebooks for loan.
- These will be an addition to the existing ipads.
- Mr. Whittick has prioritised the students in need order.
- Those lucky enough to receive a loan device will receive communication from the IT team regarding collection as and when they become available.
- The device remains the property of the school.
- A loan agreement will need to be signed by the parent on collection.
- Any loss or damage will need to be funded by the parents under their home insurance or other means.

Concerns about your child:

- Despite being open with a skeletal staff, we will not be conducting any face to face meetings with parents or accepting visitors on site during this time.
- You can email teaching and support staff, all emails are available on the school website. Staff will respond between 8.30am and 3pm, Monday to Friday. If you email outside of these times you may have to wait for a response until the next working day.
- If your child has SEND please email your child's key worker. If you are not aware of who the key worker is then please email keren.groom@crestwood.hants.sch.uk or cassie.smith@crestwood.hants.sch.uk

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Year 11 GCSE grading

Please may I remind students and parents that we are not permitted to engage in any discussion regarding the grades we will be sending to Ofqual. Please see the letter for students produced by Ofqual [here](#) and the latest guidance from the DfE [here](#).

Year 8 options

- We now have final agreement that we are suspending the option process outlined to students before we closed.
- Students will be allowed some choice between emphasising a subject in the Arts, such as Art, Music, Drama, whilst continuing to study all.

Free School Meals (FSM) in the period of closure

- Families will receive their boxes over the half term holiday.
- Unfortunately, we are not in a position to provide boxes over the summer holidays and therefore all boxes will cease from **Friday 17th July 2020**
- If your circumstances have changed and you feel you are now eligible for Free School Meals you can check here <https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/hants> or contact alison.samways@crestwood.hants.sch.uk Thank you to the parents that have done so, it is important you get your entitlement.
- If you have not had any contact from us it could be because you are not eligible or your email address on our system is wrong. If you have changed your email please let Julia Hughes know.
- Please remember the delivery days are staggered and we cannot guarantee the day the parcel will be delivered each fortnight. It will arrive at some point in the week. I apologise that we cannot be more precise, we know that some of you rely on this parcel.
- The boxes are preloaded and you cannot request alternative food. The company will do their best to change things each time but it is not guaranteed. We are trying our best to bring the food to you. Try and search for recipes you can make with the ingredients offered, you may find you can make something new to your family.
- We have created accounts in your name with Harvest Fine Foods to allow for home delivery but the billing is linked to Crestwood Community School. **Any additional food you would like from Harvest must be ordered separately and you must pay for these yourself.** Anyone trying to order from their Crestwood generated account will be contacted for additional payments by Harvest.
- You are not entitled to receive vouchers in addition to the food boxes, the boxes fulfill your entitlement. Please be aware if we had relied on the national scheme, you would have only just received your first entitlement, we were ahead of the game!

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- In order to receive these boxes you must have registered for the scheme to comply with GDPR regulations. If you have failed to register and believe you are eligible please contact julia.hughes@crestwood.hants.sch.uk.

School opening for children of critical workers

I must remind you that the government has asked parents to keep their children at home and asked schools to remain open **only for those children who absolutely need to attend**. As we are a secondary school this applies to almost all of our students.

- We operate from the Cherbourg Campus and provide supervision for a very small number of children of critical workers and vulnerable students.
- This operates on a part week basis due to need.
- The provision runs from 9am - 2.30pm.
- Students conduct the online live learning they would be doing at home.
- We have very limited spaces and have to maintain skeletal staffing to observe social distancing. Therefore we may not be able to meet your needs, despite fulfilling the criteria.
- All existing placements will be maintained, however new requests can not always be accommodated. Whilst we know this is disappointing, we have to maintain the correct staffing levels to do this. Parents may have to accept part time rather than full time arrangements, as we seek to prioritise the most vulnerable students.
- If you feel that your circumstances have changed and you are now working in the critical work sector please contact steve.gibbs@crestwood.hants.sch.uk to advise us of the support you require.

The Weekly Best bits

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- Unfortunately they seem to be getting less and less, so let's have a real surge next week please!

Finally, just a reminder of the NHS guidance:

- if you live alone and you have symptoms of coronavirus illness (COVID-19), however mild, stay at home for **7 days** from when your symptoms started. (The [ending isolation](#) section below has more information)
- after 7 days, if you do not have a high temperature, you do not need to continue to self-isolate. If you still have a high temperature, keep self-isolating until your temperature returns to normal. You do not need to self-isolate if you just have a cough after 7 days, as a cough can last for several weeks after the infection has gone
- if you live with others and you are the first in the household to have symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), then you must stay at home for 7 days, but all other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for **14 days**. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. See the [explanatory diagram](#)
- for anyone else in the household who starts displaying symptoms, they need to stay at home for 7 days from when the symptoms appeared, regardless of what day they are on in the original 14 day isolation period. The [ending isolation](#) section below has more information, and see the [explanatory diagram](#)
- staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community
- if you can, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period
- if you cannot move vulnerable people out of your home, stay away from them as much as possible
- reduce the spread of infection in your home: wash your hands regularly for 20 seconds, each time using soap and water, or use hand sanitiser; cover coughs and sneezes
- if you have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms:
 - do **not** go to a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital
 - you do not need to contact 111 to tell them you're staying at home
 - testing for coronavirus (COVID-19) is not needed if you're staying at home
- if you feel you cannot cope with your symptoms at home, or your condition gets worse, or your symptoms do not get better after 7 days, then use the [NHS 111 online](#) coronavirus (COVID-19) service. If you do not have internet access, call NHS 111. For a medical emergency dial 999

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- if you develop new coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms at any point after ending your first period of isolation (self or household) then you need to follow the same guidance on self-isolation again

I hope that you can see that we are committed to opening but only when we have clear guidance and it is safe to do so. I stress that Year 10 parents **need to request a place for their child, for the potential opening, due to health and safety requirements. If you do not do this your child will not be allowed on site.**

As it is half term next week, please do take time out to have fun and a rest. I have told my staff to do this too, so please do not expect any responses to any communications, although I know many will not switch off. I will not contact you now until Friday 5th June unless I absolutely need to.

Thank you so much for all your contact, support and lovely comments, you have no idea what it means to us all. I have said it before but I am truly privileged to be the headteacher of such an amazing school #Crestwoodfamily

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Proposal for recovery - potential planned opening from 8th June 2020

The underlying principles of this proposal are:

- It is completely safe to open, based on scientific advice.
- Minimising students in school at any one time to avoid spreading any infections
- Minimising staff in school at any one time to avoid spreading any infections
- Building the confidence of staff and students to leave their homes and feel safe
- Re-establishing relationships between staff and students
- Ensuring stringent cleaning can be undertaken between occupation periods
- Efficient approach to ensure online learning can still occur which has proved, thus far, to be having a positive impact on learning and wellbeing

A considered approach:

- It is essential that students' and staff wellbeing is paramount. Face to face should be a pleasant and enjoyable experience for all.
- Parents wishing to keep their children at home can do so, as it is at this stage their choice to do so.
- Any arrangements we make for Year 10 are **not expected to be full time.**
- Parents and students will have to agree to abide by rules through a home school agreement before they are allowed to return.
- We do not require staff or students to wear uniforms, we want people to be as comfortable as possible.
- Social 'bubbles' have been created to protect students and staff. This means we have developed groups of staff and students that are mutually exclusive, confined to certain areas of each campus.
- Students will not be permitted to leave their group or move out of their designated area. All other areas will be locked down.
- Toilets are dedicated to each teaching group, students must only use these toilets and will be allowed to go to the toilet one at a time.
- These groups will be ability based, subject based and where possible we will take into account friendships to ensure students feel as comfortable as possible.
- There will be no break times or lunch as this avoids social gathering.
- Any child breaking the rules, which compromises health and safety, will result in students being sent home.

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- Year 10 will be divided into cohorts, **A** and **B**.
- **A** will attend in the morning, **B** in the afternoon.
- In each cohort students will be assigned to smaller groups, students will be notified in advance. CA1, CA2, CB1, CB2 for Cherbourg and SA1, SA2, SA3, SB1, SB2, SB3 for Shakespeare.
- The tutor session will not be in these groups and Year Leaders will identify who should attend and when for these sessions.
- Each session is 2 hours long. Morning sessions will run from 9.45am to 11.45am, afternoon sessions 1pm - 3pm, with the same staff member.
- No other staff than those on the rota will be in school as this will avoid overwhelming students at any one point.
- Students only attend the session for their cohort, they cannot swap sessions to be with their friends.
- Gates will open 10 minutes before school starts, students are to go directly to their base, keeping a social distance.
- Each zone has a dedicated hand washing area. On entry students will be directed to hand washing and sanitising at points in the room. This will be controlled by staff.
- We ask all students and staff to bring their own drinking vessel, full, to avoid cross contamination. Water fountains will not be in use. For those who forget their drink, limited supply of water will be available.
- Students must bring their own equipment and books as we are unable to share resources due to the risk of cross contamination.
- Staff will be provided with a refreshment point for hot drinks, paper, disposable cups will be provided.
- Staff toilets and the staff rooms will be available as normal. If needed,, as these are away from other zones.
- At the end of the session students must leave the site immediately.
- No lunch will be provided and FSM students will continue to receive food parcels, reducing the risk of gatherings.
- Any Year 10 student currently travelling by school minibus or taxi will be transported as normal but at the times of their sessions.

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Learning:

- Learning will focus, in the first instance, around English, Maths, Science, History, Geography and Languages.
- The face to face learning will be supported by the current online live lessons on a Monday, Thursday and Friday for Year 10.
- Year 10 lessons taught in school we will aim to be broadcast to students learning from home in some way.
- Staff will use the face to face sessions to review online learning with students, clarify any misconceptions and set out the next 3 weeks of learning.
- Hard copies of materials can be given out at this point to aid the online live lessons, providing a complementary approach.
- If students are having a face to face session in a subject, then there will be no online lessons for that week.
- In the first week a tutor session will be held with Year 10 Tutors and half their tutees at a time. The time of this differs from 10am - 11.30am and 1pm to 2.30pm. This session is designed to allow students to get used to being back in the building and re-familiarising themselves, whilst sharing any things they have done or are concerned about.
- We may consider later, based on the situation, pop up face to face for practical based subjects such as Art.

SEN students with an EHCP:

- Some students with EHCP have found online live lessons far better at home and as a result may not wish to return for face to face sessions, which is completely acceptable.
- Government guidance states in [Supporting vulnerable children and young people during the coronavirus \(COVID-19\) outbreak](#) that for children and young people with an EHC plan in mainstream settings:
 - those in year groups specifically targeted for return should return to school, where medical advice suggests they are not clinically vulnerable to coronavirus, informed by their risk assessments, and are not [shielding and protecting people defined on medical grounds as clinically extremely vulnerable](#)
 - those in other year groups should continue to attend or not depending on their individual risk assessments.
- Any sessions we are planning will mirror the school opening arrangements for Year 10 and Critical Workers on a Tuesday and a Wednesday.

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- Intervention support is also being planned to be delivered online by smaller group sessions rather than face to face.
- Key workers will contact parents to agree individualised plans for students.
- Unfortunately, some students, including those in Year 10, will be unable to come into school as they cannot comply with social distancing or we do not have the staffing capacity to meet needs and ensure their safety. This will be decided on an individual basis by a risk assessment which will be shared with parents when the decision is made.

Vulnerable students:

- There is an expectation that these pupils will attend.
- Each individual child will be discussed and arrangements made that are best suited for that child.

Health and Safety:

- The DfE has stated it is **not** appropriate for school staff to wear PPE, however if staff and students wish to do so they can.
- The DfE has stated it is **not** appropriate for children and staff temperatures to be taken on entry, although we will intend survey staff to see if they would feel safer if this was done and they are happy to administer this.
- On entry students will be expected to wash their hands and use hand sanitiser. There are specific stations for each zone. Students will be managed by staff to use these.
- Rooms and toilets will be cleaned with **SELGEINE ULTRA**, which is a high specification disinfectant and Milton Fluid in between lessons. In classrooms this will cover all table tops, table legs, chairs, chair legs and all touch points. In toilets all sinks, toilet bowls, seats and touch points.
- The DfE has also recommended we use bleach and this will be used at the end of each day for the main clean, in addition to above, as it needs time to dry to be safe to people.
- All entrances and exits will be cleaned as per above.
- Other areas of the school will not be accessible to avoid contamination of rooms.
- Students must bring their own equipment and books as we are unable to share resources due to the risk of cross contamination.

- The existing fire evacuation plan remains in place, however, there are amendments that cover the Covid 19 reopening period. Staff will be made aware of the amendments and a fire drill and raising awareness session will take place in the first tutor time.
- SLT will remain static and contactable via mobile phone to avoid wandering from class to class and spreading any potential infection.
- A trained first aider will be on each site for each day. Any child or member of staff displaying symptoms of Covid 19 will be sent home immediately and will be required to be tested before readmission.
- Parents and visitors will not be permitted on the school grounds in any capacity.
- We encourage children to walk and cycle to school. If, in exceptional circumstances, a child needs to be dropped off, there will be a clearly signed drop off point on each campus.
- No other staff than those on the rota will be allowed on site to manage the cleaning of areas.
- Staff wishing to prepare resources must contact the Senior Site Manager, Alan Hussey for prior permission.
