School Coronavirus Update - Friday 26th June 2020**

This week we were recognised by Boris Johnson for our community efforts in a letter to local MP Paul Holmes. It was really lovely to be supported by Paul in such a way, following his recent visit to us. Also, I cannot thank those of you enough who commented on a post on the Eastleigh Neighbours Facebook page when someone asked whether Crestwood was a good school to attend. To read such positive comments was, quite frankly, overwhelming and it has made me reflect on how the strength of the #crestwoodfamily has grown during the pandemic. It has been such a monumental effort by all of us, including you and your children, the future looks so promising.

Last Friday it was announced that all school children would be returning to school in September. This is such a welcome relief but other than this announcement we have been given no guidance as to how it should be implemented. When we receive this I will share with you our thoughts, as always. It has also been announced that there will be no critical worker or vulnerable children provision provided over the summer holiday periods, therefore Crestwood will be closed throughout this time, getting ready to open in September with excitement and renewed energy.

I would welcome your views, however, on whether we do 1 or 2 Inset days at the start of term. We are due to officially return on Thursday 3rd September. To be honest with you all, we do need at least one training day for staff. This is so they can get reacquainted with policies, procedures and plans, especially as they have been away from the physical school so long whilst we have been undertaking our virtual classes. My plan is to bring all students back on Friday 4th September but want to ask if you feel this is something you agree with or whether you would prefer a return on Monday 7th September 2020. We have created a google form that can be found [here](#) to collate your responses. Opening the Friday may alleviate some children's anxieties and fears, that a Monday opening might heighten.

In addition to this we are thinking of what the first week back may look like for students. It is important that we consider how we can successfully bring students back into school after being away for so long. We want the experience to be enjoyable, whilst helping children rebuild relationships between themselves and staff. I am also mindful that Year 6 will not have had the same transition period and will need more nurture when they start.

This week face to face lessons started for Year 10. The students that attended were amazing and their behaviour was impeccable, however some that had indicated they were returning did not. I cannot emphasise enough that the learning that took place cannot be substituted by the online lessons, and, whilst I accept that it is optional to attend, I urge as many Year 10 parents to send their child into school on these days. The lessons provide further work for

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study at home which will embed and consolidate their knowledge and understanding for Year 11 and ultimately GCSE's, whilst getting children into a routine of coming into school. Next week, I would like to see more children attending please. **The last week of term for the one to one reviews is not optional and all students must attend.**

Whilst the weather is nice and restrictions have been eased, please do remember these do not take place until July 4th. I would hate for families not to follow the guidance and a further outbreak would prevent schools from reopening. We need the children in school and you need your sanity back!

Please do remember to ask for advice and support if you need it. Our pastoral support teams have phone numbers for you to use to raise concerns or positive, likewise you can email any member of staff between the hours of 8.30am - 4pm.

To ease your navigation through the rest of this letter, I have highlighted in yellow any new areas.

The government's guidance is as follows:

Stay Alert

We can all help control the virus if we all stay alert. This means you must:

- Stay at home as much as possible
- Work from home if you can
- Limit contact with other people
- Keep your distance if you go out (2 metres apart where possible)
- Wash your hands regularly
- Self-isolate if you or anyone in your household has symptoms.

Head Student Elections:

We are very excited to announce that applications for our Head Boys and Girls 2020-2021 are now open, we know Year 10 has been waiting in anticipation for a while now and welcome applications from as many of them as possible. Applications are available via email from Mrs Goodridge nicky.goodridge@crestwood.hants.sch.uk. **Closing date Friday 3rd July**

- Students who are shortlisted will soon be starting their leadership campaign via videos.
- Students in Years 7-10 will receive the videos via email.
- All students will then be invited to vote for their favourite Head Boy and Girl on their campus when they come in for their face to face meeting during the last week of term.

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Year 10:

- This week we commenced subject face to face lessons.
- We are putting a much stronger emphasis on Year 10 students returning - it is essential for a good start to Year 11.
- Students and parents should have received their group and entrance points in a letter through SchoolComms. There have been issues for some students and parents. Year 10 parents, if you have not received the letter, please send your current email address to adminoffice@crestwood.hants.sch.uk.
- On entry temperatures and registers will be taken.
- Any student attempting to enter at the wrong point will be sent to their designated entrance. If the direction is ignored, they are putting others at risk and will be immediately sent home, without question.
- Any student with a high temperature will be asked to wait for 10 minutes, whereupon it will be retaken. If it remains above 37.8, they will be sent to medical and contact made to send them home and self isolate.
- Students need to provide their own drink and lunch as there will be no food service or water fountains available
- Students can only attend if parents have requested a place and completed a [home school agreement](#). Any student attempting to attend without either of these will not be permitted to enter the school.
- All students must stick to their identified zone for the whole day.
- Student groups have been created on compatible subjects and cannot be changed.
- Students will be asked to leave immediately at the end of the day via the entrance they came.
- The timetable can be found at the end of the letter.

Year 6 Transition arrangements:

- Year 7 tutor groups have now been organised and we plan to release this information to primary schools very soon.
- Year 6 pupils will be invited in with parents from Tuesday 14th July through to Friday 17th July 2020 to meet their tutor and see their tutor base.
- Year 6 pupils will be given their Crestwood email address and guides will be issued on how they can access a special Google Classroom. This classroom is full of information and activities to help them in their transition to secondary school.
- We are also currently building a special section of the school website. The area will have video guides, virtual tours, greetings from key staff, meet the tutor videos, information from the current year 7 who will be tutor buddies in September, taster

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activities, information from different faculties and virtual tours of the school to name just a few sections!

- Whilst this “virtual” set of activities cannot take the place of our traditional transition activities - we hope that it will help year 6 students to feel that they know more about us before they join us later in the year.
- There will be more news to follow.

Online, live lessons:

- Full details of the students timetable can be found at the end of this letter for the week beginning 29th June 2020
- As a result of planning to extend the opening of the school beyond that of critical worker children to Year 10 and a small selection of children with an EHCP, we have had to make further changes to the online live lessons.
- Where students do not have lessons timetabled they are expected to complete work independently in preparation for the live lessons and for other subjects.
- We know there have been some technical issues and teething problems, please be patient.

- Please note online lessons can be accessed via mobile phones.
- The sessions are recorded so they can be viewed by students later, if they miss the live version due to restrictions in IT equipment.
- **Please use the email link or link in google classrooms and be connected to the internet, it will use a lot of mobile data.**
- We appreciate that some of your children may need additional stationery to support their work at home. If they do, can you email resourcehub@crestwood.hants.sch.uk letting us know what you need. We need to ensure social distancing and so we will prepare all orders on a Tuesday for collection on Wednesdays from the Cherbourg campus. **Please do not just turn up, you will be given an appointment time to come and collect stationery.**
- Updates to the work packs issued can be made available if required. These can also be requested by emailing resourcehub@crestwood.hants.sch.uk. If you can identify the subject/s needed that would be appreciated. Please note that these may take a little longer to compile. An appointment will also be arranged so that you can collect these once they are ready.

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SEN students with an EHCP:

- Some students with EHCP have found online live lessons far better at home and as a result may not wish to return for face to face sessions, which is completely acceptable.
- Face to face sessions have been planned and mirror the school opening arrangements for Year 10 on a Tuesday and a Wednesday.
- Intervention support has also been planned to be delivered online by smaller group sessions rather than face to face.
- Key workers will have had contact with parents to agree individualised plans for students. If this is not the case please email the key worker.
- Unfortunately, some students, including those in Year 10, will be unable to come into school when we open, as they cannot comply with social distancing or we do not have the staffing capacity to meet needs and ensure their safety. This will be decided on an individual basis by a risk assessment which will be shared with parents when the decision is made.

ICT Hardware and Internet Access for students:

- All Chrome books have now been distributed on a priority need.
- If you are still in need we have 40 ipads to loan out. Contact Mr Whittick if you would like one. andrew.whittick@crestwood.hants.sch.uk
- Anyone in receipt of a device but not engaging in learning, will be asked to return the device immediately so it can be given to someone who will use it for the purpose they were loaned.
- The device remains the property of the school.
- A loan agreement will need to be signed by the parent on collection.
- Any loss or damage will need to be funded by the parents under their home insurance or other means.

Concerns about your child:

- Despite being open with a skeletal staff, we will not be conducting any face to face meetings with parents or accepting visitors on site during this time.
- You can email teaching and support staff, all emails are available on the school website. Staff will respond between 8.30am and 3pm, Monday to Friday. If you email outside of these times you may have to wait for a response until the next working day.
- If your child has SEND please email your child's key worker. If you are not aware of who the key worker is then please email keren.groom@crestwood.hants.sch.uk or cassie.smith@crestwood.hants.sch.uk

Year 11 GCSE grading

Please may I remind students and parents that we are not permitted to engage in any discussion regarding the grades sent to Ofqual. Please see the letter for students produced by Ofqual [here](#) and the latest guidance from the DfE [here](#). Grades have now been submitted and we will now await the results on 20th August.

All Year 11 have access to the Post 16 Google Classroom where we host lots of resources from our colleges and other providers to support Year 11 in their transition to their Post 16 pathways. Colleges are posting lots of material and will also be hosting online induction events. Please do encourage your son or daughter to join this Google Classroom. If you have any problems or questions, please email Mr Buckingham or Mr Vass.

We will confirm arrangements for results day as soon as possible. However we continue to monitor advice and guidance from the Government and will update parents as things progress over the next few weeks.

Year 8 options

- This week students attended an assembly delivered by Mr. Topazio about the options process.
- Parents have been sent a video outlining the process.
- The deadline for completing the options form is Friday 3rd July

Free School Meals (FSM) in the period of closure

- Food boxes will cease from **Friday 17th July 2020**
- Free School meal vouchers will be issued for the summer holidays using the Government scheme.
- The vouchers will be £90 in value and will need to be emailed to parents and then downloaded before they can be redeemed.
- It is essential that we have your up to date email addresses to ensure you receive the voucher.
- Some products in the food parcels do have a short shelf life which does give you more food for the money we spend.

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- If your circumstances have changed and you feel you are now eligible for Free School Meals you can check here <https://www.cloudforedu.org.uk/ofsm/hants> or contact alison.samways@crestwood.hants.sch.uk Thank you to the parents that have done so, it is important you get your entitlement.
- If you have not had any contact from us it could be because you are not eligible or your email address on our system is wrong. If you have changed your email please let Julia Hughes know.
- Please remember the delivery days are staggered and we cannot guarantee the day the parcel will be delivered each fortnight. It will arrive at some point in the week. I apologise that we cannot be more precise, we know that some of you rely on this parcel.
- The boxes are preloaded and you cannot request alternative food. The company will do their best to change things each time but it is not guaranteed. We are trying our best to bring the food to you. Try and search for recipes you can make with the ingredients offered, you may find you can make something new to your family.
- We have created accounts in your name with Harvest Fine Foods to allow for home delivery but the billing is linked to Crestwood Community School. **Any additional food you would like from Harvest must be ordered separately and you must pay for these yourself.** Anyone trying to order from their Crestwood generated account will be contacted for additional payments by Harvest.
- You are not entitled to receive vouchers in addition to the food boxes, the boxes fulfill your entitlement. Please be aware if we had relied on the national scheme, you would have only just received your first entitlement, we were ahead of the game!
- In order to receive these boxes you must have registered for the scheme to comply with GDPR regulations. If you have failed to register and believe you are eligible please contact julia.hughes@crestwood.hants.sch.uk.

School opening for children of critical workers

- This provision will cease from Friday 17th July 2020 in line with the government directive.
- We operate from the Cherbourg Campus and provide supervision for a very small number of children of critical workers and vulnerable students.

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- The provision runs from 9am - 2.30pm.
- The provision is currently at capacity and we have no spaces available.
- Parents need to meet the criteria for critical workers as stipulated by the DfE
- Students conduct the online live learning they would be doing at home and the independent work in between these times.
- We have very limited spaces and have to maintain skeletal staffing to observe social distancing. Therefore, we may not be able to meet your needs, despite fulfilling the criteria.
- All existing placements will be maintained, however new requests can not always be accommodated. Whilst we know this is disappointing, we have to maintain the correct staffing levels to do this. Parents may have to accept part time rather than full time arrangements, as we seek to prioritise the most vulnerable students.
- We reserve the right to withdraw places for non attendance.
- If you feel that your circumstances have changed and you are now working in the critical work sector please contact steve.gibbs@crestwood.hants.sch.uk to advise us of the support you require.

The Weekly Best bits

- Unfortunately they seem to be getting less and less, so let's have a real surge next week please!

Finally, just a reminder of the NHS guidance:

- if you live alone and you have symptoms of coronavirus illness (COVID-19), however mild, stay at home for **7 days** from when your symptoms started. (The [ending isolation](#) section below has more information)
- After 7 days, if you do not have a high temperature, you do not need to continue to self-isolate. If you still have a high temperature, keep self-isolating until your temperature returns to normal. You do not need to self-isolate if you just have a cough after 7 days, as a cough can last for several weeks after the infection has gone
- If you live with others and you are the first in the household to have symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), then you must stay at home for 7 days, but all other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for **14 days**. The 14-day period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill. See the [explanatory diagram](#)

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- For anyone else in the household who starts displaying symptoms, they need to stay at home for 7 days from when the symptoms appeared, regardless of what day they are on in the original 14 day isolation period. The [ending isolation](#) section below has more information, and see the [explanatory diagram](#)
- staying at home for 14 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community
- if you can, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period
- if you cannot move vulnerable people out of your home, stay away from them as much as possible
- reduce the spread of infection in your home: wash your hands regularly for 20 seconds, each time using soap and water, or use hand sanitiser; cover coughs and sneezes
- if you have coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms:
 - do **not** go to a GP surgery, pharmacy or hospital
 - you do not need to contact 111 to tell them you're staying at home
 - testing for coronavirus (COVID-19) is not needed if you're staying at home
- if you feel you cannot cope with your symptoms at home, or your condition gets worse, or your symptoms do not get better after 7 days, then use the [NHS 111 online](#) coronavirus (COVID-19) service. If you do not have internet access, call NHS 111. For a medical emergency dial 999
- if you develop new coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms at any point after ending your first period of isolation (self or household) then you need to follow the same guidance on self-isolation again

The end is in sight and I do hope that we can return to normality from September. We still have to celebrate our Year 11 with a leavers' assembly and prom, it is essential they leave the school in the traditional Crestwood way, with love. I sincerely cannot wait to see more of you in the last week of term, I have missed you all so much. Please do take care of yourselves.
